



Cultural Heritage in a Digital World: the Future of the Museum and Digital Research Technologies

In this lecture series researchers and curators discuss how to bring new life to East Asian art by exploring digital technologies and virtual environments. Each speaker addresses the different functions that digital tools have in their work, and how these help them answer new research questions and broaden access to East Asian heritage. The use of photography in the conservation of ancient sites and architectural reconstruction is the focus of **Dr. Frances Terpak**'s talk; architectural modelling and digital simulation of movement are employed by **Dr. Pania Yu** in her analysis of Chinese landscape painting; and the development of a virtual environment for the museum is addressed by **Dr. Stephan von der Schulenburg** in connection to the challenges posed by the Covid pandemic.
